Paes, Bopanna set to face off in US Open mixed doubles semifinals

In what seems to be a mouth-watering clash for Indian tennis fans, Rohan Bopanna has ensured a semifinal face-off with veteran Leander Paes after the two won their respective mixed doubles matches on Day 8 of the U.S. Open in New York. The fourth-seeded pair of Paes and Hingis moved into the final-four after getting a walk-over from the Romanian pair of Simona Halep and Horia Tecau in the last-eight encounter.

Bopanna and his Chinese Taipei partner Yung-Jan Chan though had to battle hard against Su-Wei Hsieh (Chinese Taipei) and Henri Kontinen (Finland). The second-seeded Bopanna-Chan combine got the better of Hsieh and Kontinen 7-6, 5-7, 13-11 in a l hour 50 minute battle on Court 17.

Meanwhile Bopanna also continued his winning run in the men's doubles draw as he booked a quarterfinal berth along with partner Florin Mergea. Bopanna and Mergea staved off the third-round challenge from Canada's Daniel Nestor and Edouard Roger-Vasselin of France 6-7, 6-4, 6-3 in a match that lasted for just over two hours. The sixth-seeded pair dished out 10 aces as compared to the three sent down by the Canadian-French pair, which was seeded ninth.
