Unlike the eye, the ear has no lead, therefore noise penetrates without protection. Loud noises instinctively signal danger to any organism with a hearing mechanism, including human beings. In response, heart-beat and respiration accelerate. In fact, there is a general increase in the functioning brought about the flow of adrenaline released in response to fear.

Because noise is unavoidable in a complex individual society, we are constantly responding, in the same way that we would respond to danger.
