THE ANNUAL QUALITY ASSURANCE REPORT (AQAR) OF THE IQAC 2004-2005

PART A

Tararani Vidyapeeth's **Kamala College**, the only women's college in the city of Kolhapur, established in the year 1984 is located in a beautiful campus of 12 acres of land in Rajarampuri, the heart of the city Kolhapur. The college received UGC recognition under section 2(F) of the Act in May, 1987 and became eligible to receive financial assistance from UGC under section 12(b) of the act in January 1992.

The motto behind establishing the institution was to cater to the needs of women's education, to give them a separate identity of their own by promoting and enhancing the potentialities in their personality so that they would be fearless strong and sturdy women fit to face the challenges of time and life. Since the inception of the institution it has been working to provide quality higher education with an aim to develop scientific temper, inculcate moral values and to achieve overall development of personality of our students.

Our college offers undergraduate (UG) courses in Arts and Commerce streams alongwith certain other self-financing and remedial courses.

As per the NAAC guidelines we prepared the self-study report of our college and sent to NAAC, Banglore for its assessment and accreditation. We are pleased to mention that NAAC awarded \mathbf{B}^+ status to our college.

We know that the Peer-Team report of our college is a wealth of information, which provides us certain guidelines to identify our strength and weaknesses.

In pursuance of the National Action Plan of the NAAC, Banglore, for performance, evaluation, assessment and accreditation we established an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. We want to realize the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance and also to channelise the efforts and measures of our institution towards academic excellence.

The meeting of the IQAC was arranged under the Chairmanship of Dr. K. R. Patil, Secretary of the institution on Thursday the 23rd September 2004. The following plan of action was chalked out by the IQAC towards quality enhancement.

- 1) The Proposal for Career oriented courses to be sent to the U.G.C.
- 2) Establishment of Women's study Centre.
- 3) Minor Research projects to be undertaken by the faculty.
- 4) Computerization of library.
- 5) Establishment of Teacher Parent Association.
- 6) Computer knowledge to the Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff.
- 7) Application of the best practices.
- 8) Remedial coaching classes for SC / ST students.
- 9) Increase in Infrastructure facilities

With a view that professionally qualified graduates with a sound knowledge of their core discipline and expertise in a concerned skill will have more openings in service industry and self employment sectors, we sent a proposal to U.G.C. for introduction of the following career oriented courses in our colleges.

- 1) Hospital Administration and Management.
- 2) Yoga Education and Health.
- 3) Entrepreneurship.
- 4) Dramatics, allied arts and Technology.
- 5) Dietetics and Health education.

(2) We have sent Proposals of the minor research projects to the U.G.C.

Three teachers in Hindi, Sociology and Home Science subjects sent their proposals of minor research projects to the U.G.C.

(4) Computerization of Library.

The work is in progress.

- (5) The **Teacher Parent Association** is established in the College. On 13th February 2005 teachers and parents gathered to exchange and share their views regarding the advancement and enhancement of quality education. Parents gave useful suggestions.
- (6) The College organized a **ten-day workshop for teachers** on the use of computers. All the teachers spontaneously participated in it. They are benefited by it.

(7) The best practices

1. There are various prizes for the students who secured the 1st, 2nd and 3rd number in various examinations. We also give prizes to students for their outstanding performance in **sports**, **N.C.C.**, **N.S.S.** and **elocution**, **Mehandi and Rangoli Competitions**. In addition to this we arranged elocution competitions on behalf of **Forum of Free Enterprises**, **Mumbai.** The students who got 1st, 2nd and 3rd number in it were given the cash prizes of Rs. 3000/- Rs. 2000/- and Rs. 1000/- respectively. Alongwith these prizes, to promote social commitment Shri. Vishwas Vasantrao Bagal declared an award of "Late Sulekha V. Bagal Scholarship" of Rs. 25,000/- for the students who have the sense and faith for social service and social commitment. This year two students of our college namely 1) Miss. Supriya Vilas Mane (B.A. I) and 2) Miss. Deepa Prakash Nimbalkar (B.Com. I) were given this Scholarship for three years.

2. The Award of Sword of Honour:

Ex-Member of Parliament Shri. Udaysingrao Gaikwad announced the "Award of Sword of Honour" in the memory of Chhatrapati Tararani for the best student of College. The award consist of Rs. 1000/- and a Sword. This year Miss. Priyadarshini Chandrakant More (B.Com. III) is awarded the Sword of Honour for her overall performance.

(8) We are implementing **the scheme of Remedial Coaching** in the subjects of English, Accountancy, Statistics and M. Law for **SC** / **ST** students who belong to B.A. I, II, III and B. Com. I, II, III Classes.

This scheme is sanctioned by the UGC for three years. Even in the Xth Plan we provide remedial coaching, from the basic grants, to the weaker students who belong to B.A. I, II, III and B. Com. I, II, III Classes.

(9) <u>Infrastructure facilities</u>:

Women's Hostel

Due to the growing academic excellence and healthy atmosphere in our college the students from nearby villages belonging to not only to Maharashtra but also to Karnataka seek admission in our college. The number of such students is increasing. Keeping in view this situation and inadequacy of the present Hostel the institution proposed to build a new hostel for our students. We sent a proposal of the same to the UGC and UGC was very much pleased to sanction the grant of Rs. 25 lakhs for it. The building of Women's Hostel is in progress. Near about 50 students will be benefited.

ACTIVITIES REFLECTING THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES
OF THE INSTITUTIONS:

Goals and Objectives

- 1) Introduction of Career oriented subjects.
- 2) Imparting latest academic knowledge in order to make our students successful to face the challenges of life.
- 3) Promotion and enhancement of students literary and inborn skills in music, dance, dramatics and craft.
- 4) Organization of 'Self-Supporting Courses' not only for our students but for other women also.
- 5) Encouragement to players to participate in various sports at various levels to show their best performance.
- 6) Motivation of the students for further study and their preparation for facing various competitive examinations.
- 7) Enrichment of library by adding latest reference books, journals, magazines and various newspapers.
- 8) Organization of various extension activities in addition to NSS and NCC for the cultivation of values.

Apart from the curricula, there are **certain activities** carried out by the Colleges to fulfill the goals and objectives of the institution.

Since its inception, values essential for democratic citizenship are sought by the institution to be imparted through institutionalized internal practices such as celebration of national festivals, promotion of national integration through arrangement of lectures and other cultural events on the occasion of birth and death anniversaries of national heroes and leaders.

To promote all round personality of the students the College has various committees such as Elocution Committee, Magazine Committee, Competitive Examination and Career Guidance Committee, Marathi Sahitya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal, English Forum, Commerce Forum and other various clubs which organize lectures on various disciplines of learning. Various competitions like Rangoli, Mehandi etc. and cultural programmes are also arranged throughout the year.

- (2) To develop the hidden potentials of the students in music, dramatics, elocution and other allied arts we arrange **Annual Social Gathering**.
- (3) To prepare the students for the competitive world we have 'Career Guidance Cell'.
- (4) To inculcate scientific attitude, to foster unprejudiced approach and intellectual honesty we have been holding examination named 'Satyashodha Pradnya Pariksha' in collaboration with Yashwantrao Chavan Pratishthan, Mumbai and Maharashtra Andhashraddha Nirmulan Samiti.
- (5) For weaker students the college has started **Remedial Courses** in English and Accountancy.
- (6) For the **SC and ST students** who belong to B.A. I, II, III and B. Com. I, II and III classes we have been running **Remedial Courses** in English, Accountancy, Statistics and M. Law. The UGC is pleased to sanction our proposal of Remedial Courses mentioned above under its letter No. 10/65/2004 (SCT) dtd. 22nd Nov. 2004

- (7) Various competitions like 'debating, dance, essay writing etc. are held and the students who stood first, second and third in the competitions were given prizes to encourage them.
- (8) The *Debating Competition* was organized by the department of Economics and Population Education club in our college in collaboration with **Forum of Free Enterprises, Mumbai**.
- (9) The 'Printing Process Workshop' is organized by the department of Home-Science on 12/02/2005. Twenty Five Students participated enthusiastically in it. Shri. Adarsh Chavan, Head of the Department of Fashion Designing, S.I.B.E.R., demonstrated various printing processes before our students.
- (10) The College runs the following self-financing courses.
 - 1] Aerobics
 - 2] Judo Karate.
 - 3] Yogasana
- (11) To make our students strong and sturdy both physically and mentally we run a well-equipped 'Health-Club'.
 - Near about 300 students are benefited by it.
- (12) To make our students 'Society-oriented' and disciplined we have N.S.S. and N.C.C.

- (13) The College has a **Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University Centre**, which caters to the need of those students who were unable to continue their education by this or that reason. We have 'B.A.' and 'B. Com.' Courses for them.
- (14) We have well-managed 'Computer Lab'. 'Certificate Course in Office Computing' (Y.C.M.O.U.) is run by it.
- (15) As usual students are **personally counseled**. They are guided and encouraged wherever necessary.
- (16) Arts circle in our college organized 'Gujarathi Folk Dance Workshop' from 4th October to 9th October 2004. Various types like Garaba, Matukadi, Dandiya Raas, etc. were taught. 79 students participated in it. A lecture on 'Mind Training' was organized by it in collaboration with 'Muktahans' Research Foundation. Various prestigious prizes were bagged by our students who belonged to the Arts circle. One of them is the first prize for 'Best Pair' in a cultural competition organized by Sujata Motor Training School, Kolhapur.
- (17) The Nature's club organized a film show and a lecture for 'Priyadarshini Saving Group of Women', Shiroli on 'Fuel Consumption' in collaboration with 'Petroleum and Natural Gas Ministry, Government of India'. A quiz was also arranged for the women. Essay writing competition and a lecture on Environment and Industrialization and a slide show on rare plants were arranged. The most noteworthy activity of the club is that it launched 'Vermiculture Project' in the college premises in collaboration with 'Innerwheel Club, Kolhapur'.

The NSS in our College is playing its role to enhance social commitment and to inculcate the Principle 'Service to man is Service to God' among the students. - 6) **Miss. Sarika Mothe** secured **1**st **position in zonal Athletics** meet and 3rd position in inter-zonal Athletics meet. The event was long jump.
- 7) Miss. Roma Sawant, Miss. Jyoti Rajput and Miss. Dakve participated in zonal boxing tournament. They secured 1st position in their respective weight group.
