**PART A**

Tararani Vidyapeeth, a premier institution catering to the needs of women's education, runs Kamala College which is established in 1984. It is located in Rajarampuri, which is very near to Central Bus Stand and Railway Station also. The college received U.G.C. recognition under section 2(f) of the Act in May 1987 and became eligible to receive financial assistance from U.G.C. under section 12(b) of the act in January 1992.

Since its inception 1945 the institution has been striving hard to cater to needs of women's education, to give them a separate identity of their own by promoting and enhancing the potentialities in their personalities, so that they would be strong and sturdy enough to face the challenges of life and time. It is the unceasing aim of the institution to provide quality higher education by developing scientific temper, inculcating moral values and thereby achieving overall development of personality of our students.

Our college offers undergraduate courses in Arts and Commerce streams alongwith certain other self-financing and remedial courses, which are beneficial to students.

Under the chairmanship of Dr. K. R. Patil, Principal of the college we established an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post accreditation quality sustenance measure.

The meeting of the IQAC was arranged on 20<sup>th</sup> June 2005. The following plan of action was chalked out by the IQAC towards quality enhancement.

- 1) Continuation of the Remedial Coaching Classes.
  - 2) Introduction of Career Oriented Courses.
  - 3) Continuation of the self-supporting courses.
  - 4) Application of the Healthy Practices.
  - 5) Completion of the Women's Hostel building in all respects.
- (1) We have been implementing the scheme of Remedial coaching in the subjects of English, Accountancy, Statistics and M. Law for students belonging to Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) who are studying in B.A. I, II, III and B. Com. I, II & III since the year 2004-05. Special efforts are also taken in providing remedial coaching to the weaker students in B.A. and B. Com. Classes.
  - (2) With a view that professionally qualified graduates with a sound knowledge of their core discipline and expertise in a concerned skill will have more openings in service, industry and self employment sectors, our college has submitted proposal to the U.G.C. to sanction the courses: Hospital Administration and Management, Yoga Education and Health, Entrepreneurship, Dramatics, allied arts and Technology, Dietetics and Health education.

The U.G.C. arranged an interface meeting of the principals regarding the courses at Ahmedabad on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2006. Our Principal Dr. K. R. Patil attended the same and UGC is pleased to sanction the following courses –

- 1) Hospital Administration and Management.
- 2) Dietetics and Health Education.

3) Yoga Education and Health, vide its letter F.No.4-231/2006 (VE/COP) dated 23-03-2006.

We have started these courses from the year 2006-07 in our college.

(3) The college has been running the following self-financing courses.

a) Aerobics      b) Judo-Karate      c) Yogasana.

(4) The Healthy Practices

The Overall conduct of the organization is determined to an extent by the healthy practices which it inculcates within it, we, in this regard, adopted the following internal quality checks.

- a) Functioning of various committees. There are 40 committees and clubs working in our college. Periodical meetings of these committees and clubs are arranged and the principal surveys their functioning and guides them if need be.
- b) Immediate action is taken regarding the complaints and suggestions of the faculty, non-teaching staff and students.
- c) There is an active IQAC that reviews existing practices and procedures. It takes necessary steps to fulfill the goals and mission of the institution as far as possible.
  - 1) We have established our contacts with certain industries that can be a source for on the job training for the students.
  - 2) We have various committees of which the details are mentioned in the 'B' Part. We try to inculcate civic responsibility by arranging Campus-Cleaning Day, Blood-donation Camps, tree plantation, N.S.S. camps etc.
  - 3) There are various prizes for the students who secured the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> number in various examinations. We also give prizes to students for their outstanding performance in **sports, N.C.C., N.S.S. and elocution, Mehendi and Rangoli Competitions**. In addition to this

we arranged elocution competition on behalf of **Forum of Free Enterprises, Mumbai**. The students who got 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> number in it were given the cash prizes of Rs. 3000/- Rs. 2000/- and Rs. 1000/- respectively. Alongwith these prizes, to promote social commitment Shri. Vishwas Vasanttrao Bagal declared an award of **“Late Sulekha V. Bagal Scholarship” of Rs. 25,000/-** for the students who have the sense and faith in social service and social commitment. This year two students of our college namely 1) Miss. Patil Tejashree Bajirao (B.A. I) and 2) Miss. Gawade Nirmala Sadashiv (B.Com. I) were given this Scholarship for three years.

In addition to this, freeships book-bank facility and concessions are given to the needy students.

- 4) There is a credit society, which caters to the economical needs of the staff.
  - 5) We have been trying our level best to promote interactive skills, among our students by arranging group discussions, workshops and guest lectures.
  - 6) It is our motto ‘to promote all round development of personality of our students and to try to achieve the goals by efficient functioning of various committees and clubs of which the details are given in the succeeding part.
- (5) Completion of Women’s Hostel building :
- Taking into consideration the growing strength of the students who demand hostel facilities we decided to construct a women’s hostel building. We sent a proposal of the same to the U.G.C. and the U. G. C. is very much pleased to sanction the grant of Rs. 25 lakhs for it. The building of women’s hostel (Ground floor) is completed in all respects and near about 50 more students will be benefited.

## **PART B**

**ACTIVITIES REFLECTING THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES  
OF THE INSTITUTIONS:**

To promote all round personality of the students the College has various committees such as **Elocution Committee, Magazine Committee, Competitive Examination and Career Guidance Committee, Marathi Sahitya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal, English Forum, Commerce Forum** and other various clubs which organize lectures on various disciplines of learning. Various competitions like Rangoli, Mehendi etc. and cultural programmes are also arranged throughout the year.

- (1) Every year we arrange Annual Social Gathering to develop the hidden potentials of the students in music, dramatics, elocution and other allied arts. On 13<sup>th</sup> January 2006 we arranged 'Food Festival and Funny Games' and on 14<sup>th</sup> January 2006 variety show was arranged.
- (2) Due to globalisation and growing industrialization there are various job and career opportunities for the students. To prepare the students for the competitive world we have 'Career Guidance Cell'. Various seminars on 'Career Counseling in Company Secretaryship', 'Career Opportunities in call centres' Interview skills and Techniques', 'LIC agent as a career' and 'Business opportunities for women' and Workshop on revised syllabus of 'M.P.S.C.' were organised. Various lectures on 'Sure Success in competitive examination', 'Career Opportunities for students' and 'personality development' were arranged.
- (3) Every year the college conducts 'Vaidnyanik Janiva Prkalp Pariksha' in collaboration with Yashwantrao Chavan Pratishthan, Mumbai and Maharashtra Andha Sharaddha Nirmulan Samiti. In addition to their allotted workload, our teachers teach the syllabus framed by the Pratishthan and conduct the examination. The sole aim of this examination is to inculcate scientific attitude to foster unprejudiced approach and intellectual honesty in our students.

- (4) For S.C. and S.T. students studying in B.A. and B.Com. I, II and III, college runs Remedial Courses in the subjects of English, Accountancy, Statistics and M. Law. Even for weaker students the college has been running remedial courses in the subject of English and Accountancy. Due to this, these students showed their good performance in their university examinations.
- (5) ‘The vivid Kalagun Vikas Mandal’ : The Marathi Sahitya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal and English Forum in our college are striving hard to promote the literary skills in the students by arranging various competitions like Poetry Reading, Story Reading, Essay Writing, Poster Painting, Elocution etc.

The outcome of these efforts is that in the Shivaji University inter-collegiate Magazine competition our college bagged the first prize for the article in English named “Savitribai – The Woman Who Braved the Storm”, the first prize for the Hindi one act play ‘Fark Kyon ?’ and second prize for the Marathi Story ‘Bhavishya’

The Debating Competition was arranged by the Population Education club in our college in collaboration with Forum of Free Enterprises, Mumbai.

The Arts Circle in our College is also doing its best. In collaboration with Vivid Kalagun Vikas Mandal and Alumnae of our college, it organizes ‘Rasgaraba Dandiya’, ‘Traditional Day’, and fashion show. In the ‘Yuva Mahotsva’ organised by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur, Miss. Savita Mali won the third prize in the singing competition (lyric) and the dance displaying ‘Navdurga Darshan’ was very much appreciated and praised by the beholders.

- (6) We want our students not only mentally strong but also physically fit. We run well-equipped 'Health Club' where every year 300 students and more than 100 women from outside take benefit of it.
- (7) We have 'Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University Centre since 2003-2004 to cater to the educational needs of those students who were unable to continue their formal education by this or that reason. The centre runs B.A. and B.Com. courses and 400 students are studying in it. The Subjects i.e. Marathi, Hindi, Economics, History, Political Science and Sociology for B.A. III and the subjects III i.e. Economics, Banking Commerce and Accounting and Auditing for B.Com. III are taught at special level. Every year the students who are economically backward are given monetary help.
- (8) The 'Counselling cell' in our college implemented the scheme 'Apayashatun- Yashakade' in collaboration with the daily 'Sakal' and 'Manovikas Prabodhini, Kolhapur. The scheme was very beneficial to the students who were frustrated, confused and who scored less marks than their expectation. A questionnaire was prepared and distributed among these students and they were counseled accordingly. The senior teachers of Manovikas Prabodhini, Kolhapur co-operated in this regard.
- (9) We have a well managed computer lab which runs various courses in computer application.
- (10) The College takes efforts to preserve trees and to protect environment through its 'Kamala Nature Lovers' club which fosters the values among the students so that they keep environment pollution free. The students of this



club participated in the competition, which were arranged to create awareness about the environment among the people. In Panda Festival which was organised at Mumbai on 15<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> December 2005 various competitions were arranged. The students of this club participated in Mehendi Rangoli and street-play competitions. We are very much proud to mention that the street play named ‘Samashya Mahanagarachya : Samashya Mumbaichya’ enacted by the students of this club won the first prize and Miss. Smita Patil won the second prize in ‘Rangoli Competition’

- (11) To generate social commitment among our students we have N.S.S. and N.C.C. The activities carried out by the NSS and NCC are described under the heading community services.
- (12) Grievance Redressal Cell : The cell has been trying to solve the problems of the students. For this purpose we kept a ‘Suggestion Box’ in the library and students are told to submit their complaints in the first week of every month. The cell solved the students complaints about library and office work. Students are responding this activity spontaneously.
- (13) Population Education Club : We run Population Education Club on behalf of Adult and continuing Education Department, Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The club arranges various lectures and competitions which will create social awareness and awareness about population among the students’.
- (14) Social Science Club : Our students should know the current affairs in social, cultural, historical and political fields. In view of this the social science club arranges various lectures for the benefit of the students.

- (15) Yoga and Health Club : This club makes efforts to make the students aware about their physical and mental health.
- A group discussion on ‘The importance of Breast-feeding’ was arranged. Recipe competition was also arranged, in which 20 students participated. Essay competition, Poster Painting with slogans competition were arranged in collaboration with Marathi Sahitya Mandal and Innerwheel club, Kolhapur. Dr. Gayatri Harshe delivered a speech on ‘Adolescent and AIDS Awareness’. To encourage the students prizes and certificates were given to them.
- (16) Commerce Forum : The students belonging to commerce faculty were counselled regarding the M.B.A. and C.A. entrance examinations.
- (17) Alongwith ‘Kamala’ Magazine, we publish various articles of the students on different issues related to different occasions through our wallpaper named ‘Gunjarav’. Thus the inborn literary skills of the students are promoted.
- (18) Staff Academy : The Staff Academy arranges lectures on the latest issues concerning art, language, science literature etc. in order to exchange the views and opinions of scholars and learned people with our faculty.
- (19) We want to create historical awareness in our students by arranging tours to historical places. We want them to see Nature with its splendid beauty. This helps them to know the life outside the four walls. To fulfill this object there is Tour Committee in our college which arranges tours and trips for the benefit of the students.

- (20) Anti Sexual Harassment Committee : Our students should behave freely and that too in a secure atmosphere, therefore we have ‘Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee in our college. The committee published a special wallpaper issue entitled ‘Stri-Jsanma Hi Tuzi Kahani’ by collecting newspaper cutting related to atrocities committed against women.
- (21) Literacy Mission : Literacy Mission in our college encourages our students to teach the illiterates around them. Our students spontaneously participated in this mission. A lecture on the ‘Need of Literacy’ was arranged.
- (22) To inculcate the principles of democracy to foster the decision-making policy and to participate in the overall functioning of the college we have Students Council. We get feed back from it related to teaching, learning, evaluation, and different activities to be launched upon. Thus we try to inject the quality of leadership among our students.

**Q. 2)** New Academic programmes initiated (U.G.)

As per the guidelines of Hon. Supreme Court, Shivaji University, Kolhapur directed all its affiliated colleges to introduce the subject named “Environment Studies”. So we introduced the subject for the second year of B.A. and B. Com. courses.

**Q. 3)** Innovations in curricular design and transactions.

The College has accepted and implemented the UGC modeled syllabi prescribed by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

Smt. R. D. Pandit, (Member, B.O.S. and Head of Department of Home Science) and Smt. V. P. Sathe (Teacher in the same department) have framed the Syllabi of B.A. I Class as per the U.G.C. model. The Syllabus

for B.A. II class which is framed by them is already implemented by Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

- 1) Smt. R. D. Pandit is also busy in framing the syllabus for Food Science & Quality Control for M. Sc. Classes run by Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

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**Q. 18) Community Services**

Service to man is service to God. To inculcate this principle among our students we have National Service Scheme in which 200 students and 4 teachers are working. The village named 'Dhabadhabawadi' has been adopted. The following activities are carried out by it in the adopted village and college campus.

**N.C.C. :**

In the task of ‘nation-building’ N.C.C. plays its vital role. There are 50 cadets in the N.C.C. who actively participated in helping the flood-affected people at Sainik Takali cantonment continuously for two days. 40 cadets donated blood on the occasion of the birth anniversary of Hon. Late Dr. V. T. Patil. 5 cadets participated in the ‘pulse polio’ inoculation programme.

6 cadets participated in Thal Sainik camp, 5 were selected for R.D. camp. 2 cadets participated in the trekking camp Ooti. 2 cadets were selected in the team of Maharashtra for the National Youth Integration programme. One cadet participated in National Integration camp.

We have a well established health club and students are made compulsory to take benefit of it by charging them minimum fee. The Physical Director who is in-charge of the health club guides and demonstrates the students about how to maintain their physical fitness.

**Q. 33) Performance in Sports activities :**

The college has set up its own unique tradition in sports. The sportspersons of our college have participated in various games like Table Tennis, Volley Ball, Kho-Kho, Hand-ball, Judo-Karate, Boxing, Cricket and Athletics.

It is a matter of special pride and impregnable delight to state that Miss. Tejaswini Sawant, the past student of our college, glorified the name and fame of our country in all over the world with her refulgent and spectacular performance in 100 mtr. Rifle Shooting competition (commonwealth games) held at Melbourne, Australia during this year i.e. 2005-2006. She was the best sportsperson in Basket Ball and Hand Ball in our college. In the year 1999-2000 when she was studying in our college in B.A. II class she participated in the National Rifle Shooting competition at Philore (Punjab).

The college has been trying to create such an alluring splendor in the field of sports and games since its inception.

- 1) Miss. Jyoti Katkar, Roma Sawant and Madhuri Kadam participated in All India Inter-University Cricket competition and Miss. Gayatri Bhosale participated in all India Inter-University Table-Tennis competition.

- 2) At National Level Miss. Kavita Chavan and Sarika Mothe participated in Net Ball, Samina Jamadar and Vaishali Dhade in Judo and Supriya Pakale, Sonal Gadgil, Kavita Chavan, Rakhi Nangare, Komal Patil and Rasika Bhosale in Korf Ball and Miss. Sarika Patil in Kho-Kho.

In Kolhapur Zonal Boxing competition Miss. Jyoti Katkar, Roma Sawant, Aishwarya Dakave, Shamal Khandagale, Jyoti Rajaput bagged the gold medal. The Sports Department of our college organised Judo-Karate and Yoga courses during the period from 20<sup>th</sup> December 2005 to 20<sup>th</sup> January 2006.
