THE ANNUAL QUALITY ASSURANCE REPORT (AQAR) OF THE IQAC 2006-2007

PART A

KAMALA COLLEGE, the only women's college in the city of Kolhapur, is run by Tararani Vidyapeeth, the unique institution that strives hard to cater to the needs of women's education. The college is established in 1984. It received the U.G.C. recognition under section 2(f) of the act in May 1987 and became eligible to receive financial assistance from the U.G.C. under section 12(b) of the act in January 1992.

Our college offers undergraduate courses in Arts and Commerce streams alongwith certain other self-financing, career oriented and remedial courses which are beneficial to the students.

Under the chairmanship of Dr. K. R. Patil, Principal of the college we established the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post accreditation quality sustenance measure.

The meeting of the IQAC was arranged on 25th June 2006. The following plan of action was chalked out by the IQAC towards quality enhancement.

1) To organize a state level seminar on the theme of 'Students participation in the Enhancement of the Quality of Higher Education'.

- Continuation of the Remedial Coaching Classes for the SC /ST students.
- 3) Continuation of the Remedial Coaching Classes for the weaker students other that the SC /ST students.
- Continuation of the previous and introduction of some other new selffinancing courses.
- 5) Introduction of Career Oriented Courses.
- 6) Introduction of the Coaching Classes for Entry in Services for SC / ST students.
- 7) To send Minor Research Projects to the U.G.C.
- 8) To construct the Canteen Building.
- 9) Application of Healthy practices.

This action plan was carried out in the following way.

- 1) We have organised a state level seminar on the theme 'Students participation in the Enhancement of the Quality of Higher Education' on 16th September 2006 in our college. The total number of participants was 239, which included teachers, Principals and persons from the management. It was a fruitful event for all the participants. The seminar was sponsored by NAAC Bangalore.
- We have been implementing the scheme of Remedial Coaching in the subject of English, Accountancy, Statistics and Business Regulatory Framework for students belonging to S.C. and S.T. who are studying in B.A. I, II, III and B.Com. I, II, III since the year 2004-05.
- 3) In addition to this we have been implementing the scheme of Remedial Coaching in the subject of English, Accountancy, Economics etc. for the weaker students other than SC / ST since long.
- The college has been running the self-financing courses a) Aerobics,b) Judo-Karate c) Yogasana. From this year, we started the following courses a) Spoken English, b) Financial Accounting / Tally.

- The U.G.C. also sanctioned our proposal to introduce the following career-oriented courses in our college. (a) Yoga Education and Health (b) Hospital Management and Administration (c) Dietetics and Health Education. 82 Students have taken admissions to these courses. We have been running these courses since this year.
- 6) The U.G.C. sanctioned our proposal of Coaching Classes for Entry in Services for S.C. and S.T. students. We are conducting these classes from this year. General English, General Knowledge, Numerical Aptitude, Intelligence etc. are the subjects taught to these students. We are trying our level best to prepare these students for the competitive examinations.
- 7) The college sent minor research projects of the following teachers to the U.G.C.

These minor research projects were sanctioned by the U.G.C. and work of these teachers in this regard is in progress.

8) With the assistance of the U.G.C., the construction of the Canteen building is going on. The U.G.C. is pleased to sanction the grant of Rs.4,16,160/- for it.

9) The Healthy Practices:

The overall conduct of the organization is determined to an extent by the healthy practices which it inculcates within it. We in this regard adopted the following internal quality checks.

- a) Functioning of various committees There are in all 40 committees and clubs working in our college. Periodical meetings of these committees and clubs are arranged and the Principal surveys their functioning and guides them if need be.
- b) Immediate action is taken regarding the complaints and suggestions of the faculty, non-teaching staff and students.
- c) There is an active IQAC that reviews existing practices and procedures. It takes necessary steps to fulfill the goals and mission of the institution as far as possible.
- d) We have established our contacts with certain industries that can be a source for on the job training for the students.
- e) We have various community welfare schemes which are mentioned in the 'B' part. We try to inculcate civic responsibility by arranging campus, blood donation camps, tree plantation, N.S.S. camps etc.
- f) There are various prizes for the students who secured the 1st, 2nd and 3rd number in various examinations. We also give prizes to students for their outstanding performance in sports, N.C.C., N.S.S., various elocutions, Mehandi and Rangoli Competitions. In addition to this we arranged elocution competition on behalf of

Forum of Free Enterprises, Mumbai. The students who got 1st, 2nd and 3rd number in it were given the cash prizes of Rs. 3000/-Rs. 2000/- and Rs. 1000/- respectively. Alongwith these prizes, to promote social commitment Shri. Vishwas Vasantrao Bagal declared an award of "Late Sulekha V. Bagal Scholarship" of Rs.25,000/- for the students who have the sense and faith in social service and social commitment. This year two students of our college namely 1) Miss. Ashwini Mahadik (B.A. I) and 2) Miss. Megha Patil (B.Com.I) were given this Scholarship for three years.

In addition to this, freeships, book bank facility and concessions are given to the needy students. There is a credit society, which gives loans to the staff.

- g) We have been trying our level best to promote interactive skills among our students by arranging group discussions, workshops and guest lectures.
- h) It is our motto to promote all round development of personality of our students and to try to achieve the goals by efficient functioning of various committees and clubs of which the details are given in the succeeding part.

PART B

ACTIVITIES REFLECTING THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES
OF THE INSTITUTIONS:

The Mission:

- 1) Dissemination of women's education and inculcation of need based academic and intellectual skills.
- 2) Inculcate moral values and scientific temper.
- 3) Overall development of personality.

Goals:

- 1) Introduction of career-oriented subjects.
- 2) Imparting latest academic knowledge in order to make our students successful to face the challenges of life.
- 3) Promotion and enhancement of students' literary and inborn skills in music, dance, dramatics and craft.
- 4) Organization of 'Self-Supporting Courses' not only for our students but for other women, also.
- 5) Encouragement to players to participate in various sports at various levels to show their best performance.
- 6) Motivation of the students for further study and their preparation for facing various competitive examinations.
- 7) Enrichment of library by adding latest reference books, journals, magazines and various newspapers.
- 8) Organization of various extension activities in addition to NSS and NCC for the cultivation of values.

To promote all round personality of the students the College has various committees such as Elocution Committee, Magazine Committee, Competitive Examination and Career Guidance Committee, Marathi Sahitya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal, English Forum, Commerce Forum and other various clubs which organize lectures on various disciplines of learning. Various competitions like Rangoli, Mehandi etc. and cultural programmes are also arranged throughout the year.

- (1) Every year we arrange Annual Social Gathering to develop the hidden potentials of the students in music, dramatics, elocution and other allied arts. On 13th January 2007 we arranged 'Food Festival and Funny Games' and on 14th January 2007 variety show was organized.
- (2) To prepare the students for the competitive world we have 'Career Guidance Cell'. Various seminars on 'Career Counseling in company Secretaryship', 'Career Opportunities for women in Merchant Navy' and 'Computer Awareness' were arranged. In addition to this, workshops on 'personality development and Interviews Technique', How to present yourself', career opportunities in B.P.O. were arranged. Lecture on 'Opportunities for women in Management Field' was also arranged. As a part of placement activities Gokhale Gokhale and Associates conducted campus interview for the post of 'Audit Assistant' in our College. Four candidates of our college were selected for that post and joined their duties from 1st April 2007.
- (B) Every year the college conducts 'Vaidnyanik Janiva Prakalp Pariksha' in collaboration with Yashwantrao Chavan Pratishthan, Mumbai and Maharashtra Andha Shraddha Nirmulan Samiti. In addition to their allotted workload, our teachers teach the syllabus framed by the Pratishthan and

conduct the examination. The sole aim of this examination is to inculcate scientific attitude to foster unprejudiced approach and intellectual honesty in our students.

- (3) We have 'Maharashtra Vivek Wahini' which strives hard to create scientific attitude human values and intellectual approach among students and villagers. Students are encouraged to read the biographies of eminent people. They are guided how to prevent environmental pollution, how to preserve and how to use natural resources like petrol. Our students counsel the neighboring villagers about the hazards of drug addiction dowry system and corruption.
- (4) In addition to this, we have Andhshraddha Nirmulan Samitee It tries to eradicate blind beliefs and superstitions. We conduct 'Vaidnyanik Janiva Prakalp Pariksha' with the help of Maharashtra Andha Shraddha Nirmulan Samitee, Satara. Students are informed about the blind beliefs and superstitions about serpents, Ghosts etc. and they are told to create consciousness among their neighbours. This year 50 students appeared for the exam and all of them passed in it.
- (5) For S.C. and S.T. students studying in B.A. and B.Com. I, II and III, college runs Remedial Courses in the subjects of English, Accountancy, Statistics and M. Law. Even for weaker students other than SC /ST students the college has been running remedial courses in the subject of English and Accountancy. Due to this, these students showed their good performance in their university examinations.
- (6) 'The vivid Kalagun Vikas Mandal': The Marathi Sahitya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal and English Forum in our college are striving hard to promote the literary skills in the students by arranging various competitions like Poetry Reading, Story Reading, Essay Writing, Poster Painting, Elocution etc. Due to these efforts in "Shivaji University Intercollegiate

Magazine Competition" our college bagged the first prize for the article in Hindi named 'Ek Rutu Aye, Ek Rutu Jaye".

The Debating Competition was arranged by the Population Education Club in our college in collaboration with Forum of Free Enterprises, Mumbai.

The Arts Circle in our College is also doing its best. Miss. Savita Mali participated in the programmes entitled 'Maharashtra Sangitaratna' and 'Sahayadri Antakshari' which were telecasted on Sahayadri Channel. Our students participated in the rally in traditional costumes during 'Dasara Mahotsav' organised by the Collector of Kolhapur. In addition to this students participated in the programme 'Hello, How are you?' broadcasted by 'B' Channel, Kolhapur.

Miss Sheetal Konduskar won the third prize for 'Miss Photogenic face' in youth Icon programme organised by G.S. Group Kolhapur. Our students participated in various competitions organised by M.K.C.L. and M.C.E.D.

- (7) We want our students not only mentally strong but also physically fit. We run well-equipped 'Health Club' which was established in 1993, where every year 300 students and more than 100 women from outside take benefit of it. There is multi-gym and 40 latest equipment in the club. Near about 2000 women from outside have taken advantage of it, until now.
- (8) We have 'Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University Centre since 2003-2004 to cater to the educational needs of those students who were unable to continue their formal education by this or that reason. The centre runs B.A. and B.Com. courses and 400 students are studying in it. The Subjects i.e. Marathi, Hindi, Economics, History, Political Science and Sociology for B.A. III and the subjects i.e. Economics, Banking Commerce and Accounting and Auditing for B.Com. III are taught at special level. We are very much happy to note that this year's batch is the first batch that was awarded degrees.

- (9) Every year the students who are economically backward are given monetary help.
- (10) The 'Counselling cell' in our college implemented the scheme 'Apayashatun-Yashakade' in collaboration with the daily 'Sakal' and 'Manovikas Prabodhini, Kolhapur. The scheme was very beneficial to the students who were frustrated, confused and who scored less marks than their expectation. A questionnaire was prepared and distributed among these students and they were counseled accordingly. The senior teachers of Manovikas Prabodhini, Kolhapur co-operated in this regard. This year it started telephonic counselling during the examination period. Those students who were confused during the exam phoned the members of the cell and the members very delicately created positive attitude in the minds of these confused students. These students were guided about the study skills. Thus the moral and emotional support is generated in the minds of the students, who are unsuccessful in the SSC / HSC Board examinations.
- (11) We have a well-managed computer lab, which runs various courses in computer application. This year we started 'Financial Accounting / Tally' and Office Automation / Basic Computer courses. For these courses 35 and 18 students have taken admission respectively.
- (12) The College takes efforts to preserve trees and to protect environment through its 'Kamala Nature Lovers' club, which fosters the values among the students so that they keep environment pollution free. On 17th July 2006 our club in collaboration with Vishwa-prakriti Nidhi – Bharat, Kolhapur Division, Kolhapur sold plants under the 'Go Green Mission'. Our students bought 1400 plants. Poster exhibition was also arranged.
- (13) To generate social commitment among our students we have N.S.S. and N.C.C. The activities carried out by the NSS and NCC are described under the heading 'Community Services'.

- (14) Grievance Redressal Cell: The cell has been trying to solve the problems of the students. For this purpose we kept a 'Suggestion Box' in the library and students are told to submit their complaints in the first week of every month. The cell solved the students' complaints about library and office work. Students are responding this activity spontaneously.
- (15) Population Education Club: We run Population Education Club on behalf of Adult and continuing Education Department, Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The club arranges various lectures and competitions which will create social awareness and awareness about population among the students'. We celebrate various days like 'Teachers Day', 'World Population Day', 'Literacy Day', the birth anniversary of Hon'ble persons like Late Lal Bahadur Shastri and the father of Nation: Mahatma Gandhi.

The Club arranged Elocution Competition in the loving memory of Seth Walchand Hirachand on behalf of 'Forum of Free Enterprises' on 13 December 2006. Miss. Arati Dhangonda Patil won the first prize of Rs.3,000/-, Sheetal Koparde won the second prize of Rs.2,000/- and Pradnya Redekar won the third prize of Rs.1,000/-.

- (16) Social Science Club: Our students should know the current affairs in social, cultural, historical and political fields. In view of this the social science club arranges various lectures for the benefit of the students. Shri Chandrakant Patgaonkar delivered a speech on "Mahatma Gandhi: His Life and works". The students of this club attended a workshop on 'Job Opportunities' held at D.D. Shinde Sarkar College, Kolhapur.
- (17) Yoga and Health Club: This club makes efforts to make the students aware about their physical and mental health. On the occasion of 'Breast Feeding Day' i.e. 6th August 2006 a group discussion between the students and lecturers of Home Science Department was organised in our college. On 8th September 2006 a competition on 'Neutrient Recipe' was arranged.

- On 10-12-2006 famous Dietician Smt. Shruti Muthe delivered a speech on "Teen agers beliefs about diet and need of balanced diet" before our students. Our students attended 'Dental Checkup Camp' at Vivekanand College.
- (18) Commerce Forum: The students belonging to commerce faculty were counselled regarding the M.B.A. and C.A. entrance examinations.
- (19) To enhance the literary skills of our students along-with 'Kamala' Magazine, we publish various articles of the students on different issues related to different occasions through our wallpaper named 'Gunjarav'. Special wallpaper issues on 'Scientific Awareness', 'Rutu Hirva' Hindi Day and the Birth Anniversaries of late Hon. V. T. Patil, the former President of our institution, Lal Bahadur Shastri and the father of Nation: Mahatma Gandhi were displayed.
- (20) Staff Academy: The Staff Academy arranges lectures on the latest issues concerning art, language, science literature etc. in order to exchange the views and opinions of scholars and learned people with our faculty. This year Dr. Jagannath Patil delivered a lecture on "Re-accreditation by NAAC"
- (21) We want to create historical awareness in our students by arranging tours to historical places. We want them to see Nature with its splendid beauty. This helps them to know the life outside the four walls. To fulfil this object there is Tour Committee. This year we arranged tours to Vijaydurga, Devgad, Kunkeshwar, Ozar, Malvan, Sindhudurga, Tarkarli, Ganpatipule etc.
- (22) Anti Sexual Harassment Committee: Our students should behave freely and that too in a secure atmosphere, therefore we have 'Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee in our college. To acquaint our students with various laws and to make them aware about the injustice caused to women we arranged a lecture on 'Sexual Harassment of women and Legal

provision for them'. The lecture was delivered by Adv. Manisha Patil, on 23rd November 2006.

In addition to this Essay Competition on 'Women Literacy' and other problems' was organised.

- (23) Literacy Mission: Literacy Mission in our college encourages our students to teach the illiterates around them. Our students spontaneously participated in this mission. We celebrated 'International Literacy Day' on 4th September 2004.
- (24) To inculcate the principles of democracy, to foster the decision-making policy and to participate in the overall functioning of the college we have Students Council. We get feed back from it related to teaching, learning, evaluation, and different activities to be launched upon. Thus we try to inject the quality of leadership among our students.

Service to man is service to God. To inculcate this principle among our students we have National Service Scheme in which 200 students and 4 teachers are working. The village named 'Dhabadhabewadi' has

been adopted. The following activities are carried out by it in the adopted village and college campus.

- 7) Arrangement of two day camp at the adopted village Dhabadhabewadi in order to participate it into 'Nirmal Gram Competition' The effect of the camp was that we created the good sanitary conditions with the help of the villagers. The village was 100% "Nirmal".

The special camp was organised in the campus of Shivaji University, Kolhapur from 20-11-2006 to 29-11-2006. Our students pulled out weeds in the area of department of Geography, South and North 'D' circle of Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

During the evening session lectures on various topics like "personality development", "The Age of the Earth", "Mental health and Tension free life", "Balshali Yuvak, Balshali Bharat" were delivered by Shri. B. M.Hiredekar, Shri. B. N. Shinde, Shri. A. S. Ghaste and Shri. Sudhir Ingale respectively.

B) N.C.C. :

In the task of 'nation-building' N.C.C. plays its vital role. During this year the NCC in our college established 'The Adventure Club'. The club tries to generate leadership qualities and adventure ability to face disaster among our NCC cadets. 25 students are members of it.

The NCC department of our college organised one day 'Advanture Activity' at Palsambe, Tal. Gaganbawada. 25 cadets participated in it. These

participants were given opportunities to handle different instruments used for trekking. The camp proved fruitful because it created interest and enthusiasm in the cadets. Miss. Madhuri Prakash Ayrekar (C.PL) was awarded 'The Chief Minister's Scholarship' of Rs. 2000/-.

The cadet Miss. Mugdha Bendre and SGT Miss. Sukeshini Sutar were selected for National Training Camp held at Ooti. SGT Miss. Sukeshini Sutar was also selected for National Integration camp held at Bikaner, Rajasthan, and Thal Sainik Camp I, II, III and IV. L/CPL Miss. Manisha Bhokare and Pallavi Patil were selected for Pre. R.D.C. I, II and III.

The NCC officer LT Prof. Smt. V. P. Sathe successfully completed the Refresher course in 'A' Grade for NCC officers held at Gwalior. 25 cadets donated blood on the occasion of the birth anniversary of the late President – Founder of Tararani Vidyapeeth Hon. Shri. V. T. Patil.

25 cadets passed 'C' certificate exam and 3 cadets passed 'B' certificate examination.

For this purpose there is a committee which scrutinizes the students' appraisal of the teachers and submits its findings and analyses regarding the same to the principal. The Principal peruses the students' suggestions and evaluation and gives necessary suggestions to the concerned teachers individually.

Women's hostel building (Ground Floor) is completed in all respects. Nearabout 50 more students will be provided the hostel facility. Even during Diwali and summer vacation the girl students from outside are provided this facility. In this way there is optimum use of the hostel building.

Q. 27) Technology up-gradation.

Internet is used in teaching. LCD Projector and CD's are also used in teaching and other functions.

Q. 28) Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students.
The internet facility is available at reasonable rate.

Q. 29) Financial Aid to Students:

Financial aid of Rs. 9,700/- was given to 39 students during the year 2006-07.

Q. 30) Activities and support from Alumni Association.

- 1) It arranged competition on 'Nutrient Diet'
- 2) It arranged a lecture on 'How to prepare for Board Exam.' delivered by Dr. Madhavi Pawar for the students who reside in College Hostel.

Q. 31) Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association
