PART A

KAMALA COLLEGE, the only women's college in the city of Kolhapur, is run by Tararani Vidyapeeth, the unique institution that strives hard to cater to the needs of women's education. The college is established in 1984. It received the U.G.C. recognition under section 2(f) of the act in May 1987 and became eligible to receive financial assistance from the U.G.C. under section 12(b) of the act in January 1992.

Our college offers undergraduate courses in Arts and Commerce streams alongwith certain other self-financing, career oriented and remedial courses which are beneficial to the students.

Under the chairmanship of Dr. K. R. Patil, Principal of the college we established the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post accreditation quality sustenance measure. This year Dr. Sarjerao **Salunkhe** is invited as a member of IQAC in the place of Dr. Waingankar.

The meeting of the IQAC was arranged on Wednesday, 27th June 2007. The following plan of action was chalked out by the IQAC towards quality enhancement.

- 1) Introduction of B.C.A. Course.
- 2) Introduction of Home Science at M.A. Level.

- 3) To send Minor Research Projects of the teachers to U.G.C.
- 4) To organise a state / national level seminars on 'Career Oriented Courses'.
- 5) To organise workshops for students and teachers under the 'Lead College Scheme'.
- 6) To complete the canteen building in all respects.
- 7) Continuation of the self-supporting courses.
- 8) Continuation of the Career Oriented Courses.
- 9) Proposals to be sent to the U.G.C. under Innovative Programme.
- 10) Application of the healthy practices.

This action plan was carried out in the following way.

- 1) The B.C.A. Course is started and 80 students have taken admission in it.
- 2) The proposal to introduce Home Science at Post Graduate level is sent to Shivaji University, Kolhapur which is sent to the Government of Maharashtra for its sanction and the same is sanctioned.
- 3) The U.G.C. has sanctioned the Minor Research Project of Smt. N. S. Dhumal.
- 4) The proposals to organise a State / National level seminars on 'Career Oriented Courses' and 'Methodology of Re-accreditation' are sent to the U.G.C. for financial assistance.

On 9th March 2008 we organised a one day workshop on 'The orientation of the female members in the Grampanchayats regarding their duties and rights' in collaboration with the Department of Adult and Continuing Education, Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

Out of these five 'Basic Computer and Information Technology' is sanctioned by the U.G.C. The U.G.C. is also pleased to sanction the proposal of 'P.G. Diploma in Yoga Therapy'.

10) The Healthy Practices :

The overall conduct of the organization is determined to an extent by the healthy practices, which it inculcates within it. We in this regard adopted the following internal quality checks.

- a) Functioning of various committees – There are in all 40 committees and clubs working in our college. Periodical meetings of these committees and clubs are arranged and the Principal surveys their functioning and guides them if need be.
- b) Immediate action is taken regarding the complaints and suggestions of the faculty, non-teaching staff and students.
- c) There is an active IQAC that reviews existing practices and procedures. It takes necessary steps to fulfill the goals and mission of the institution as far as possible.
- d) We have established our contacts with certain industries that can be a source for on the job training for the students.
- e) We have various community welfare schemes which are mentioned in the 'B' part. We try to inculcate civic responsibility by arranging various camps like blood donation camps, tree plantation, N.S.S. camps, etc.
- f) There are various prizes for the students who secured the 1st, 2nd and 3rd position in various examinations. We also give prizes to students for their outstanding performance in

sports, N.C.C., N.S.S., various Elocutions, Mehendi and Rangoli Competitions. In addition to this we arranged elocution competition on behalf of Forum of Free Enterprises, Mumbai. The students who got the 1st, 2nd and 3rd position in it were given the cash prizes of Rs.3000/- Rs. 2000/- and Rs. 1000/- respectively. Alongwith these prizes, to promote social commitment Shri. Vishwas Vasantrao Bagal declared an award of “Late Sulekha V. Bagal Scholarship” of Rs.25,000/- for the students who have the sense and faith in social service and social commitment. This year two students of our college namely 1) Miss. Jadhav Dipali Satappa (B.A. I) and 2) Miss. Patil Ashwini Dattatray (B.Com.I) were given this Scholarship for three years.

In addition to this, freeships, book bank facility and concessions are given to the needy students. There is a credit society, which gives loans to the staff.

- g) We have been trying our level best to promote interactive skills among our students by arranging group discussions, workshops and guest lectures.
- h) It is our motto to promote all round development of personality of our students and to try to achieve the goals by efficient functioning of various committees and clubs of which the details are given in the succeeding part.

PART B

**ACTIVITIES REFLECTING THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES
OF THE INSTITUTIONS:**

The Mission :

- 1) Dissemination of women's education and inculcation of need based academic and intellectual skills.
- 2) Inculcate moral values and scientific temper.
- 3) Overall development of personality.

Goals :

- 1) Introduction of career-oriented subjects.
- 2) Imparting latest academic knowledge in order to make our students successful to face the challenges of life.
- 3) Promotion and enhancement of students' literary and inborn skills in music, dance, dramatics and craft.
- 4) Organization of 'Self-Supporting Courses' not only for our students but for other women, also.
- 5) Encouragement to players to participate in various sports at various levels to show their best performance.
- 6) Motivation of the students for further study and their preparation for facing various competitive examinations.
- 7) Enrichment of library by adding latest reference books, journals, magazines and various newspapers.
- 8) Organization of various extension activities in addition to NSS and NCC for the cultivation of values.

To promote all round personality of the students the College has various committees such as **Elocution Committee, Magazine Committee, Competitive Examination and Career Guidance Committee, Marathi Sahitya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal, English Forum, Commerce Forum** and other various clubs which organize lectures on various disciplines of learning. Various competitions like Rangoli, Mehendi etc. and cultural programmes are also arranged throughout the year.

- (1) Every year we arrange Annual Social Gathering to develop the hidden potentials of the students in music, dramatics, elocution and other allied arts. On 14th January 2008 we arranged 'Food Festival and Funny Games' and on 15th January 2008 variety show was organized.
- (2) To prepare the students for the competitive world we have 'Career Guidance Cell'. Various Lectures on 'Managerial and Communicative Skills', 'Air Hostess: The Best Career for Women', 'Employment and Opportunities of Self-Employment' and 'Business Computing' were arranged. In addition to this, workshops on 'Personality Development' and 'Preparation for MBA Entrance Test' were arranged. Seminar on 'Career Opportunities for women in Animation' was also arranged. As a part of placement activities Gokhale and Associates conducted campus interview for the post of 'Audit Assistant' in our College. Four candidates of our college were selected for the same and joined their duties. We arranged a seminar on behalf of ICICI Prudential and LIC in our College. A campus interview for 'Project Trainees and Financial Advertisers' was also conducted in our college.

- (3) We have 'Maharashtra Vivek Wahini' which strives hard to create scientific attitude, human values and intellectual approach among students and villagers. They are guided how to prevent environmental pollution, how to preserve and how to use natural resources like petrol. Students are instructed to think rationally by applying 'cause-effect relationship' to the day-to-day incidents and events. Activities such as tree plantation arrangement of elocution and poetry reading competitions, eradication of blind beliefs, Anti dowry and anti drug activities were also carried out.
- (4) In addition to this, we have Andhshraddha Nirmulan Samitee It tries to eradicate blind beliefs and superstitions. We conduct 'Vaidnyanik Janiva Prakalp Pariksha' with the help of Maharashtra Andha Shraddha Nirmulan Samitee, Satara. Students are informed about the blind beliefs and superstitions about serpents, ghosts, eclipse, etc. and they are told to create consciousness among their neighbours.
- (5) For weaker and SC /ST students the college has been running remedial courses in the subject of English and Accountancy.
- (6) The vivid Kalagun Vikas Mandal, The Marathi Sahitya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal and English Forum in our college are striving hard to promote the literary skills in the students by arranging various competitions like Poetry Reading, Story Reading, Essay Writing, Poster Painting, Elocution, etc. Due to these efforts in "Shivaji University Intercollegiate Magazine Competition" our college bagged the first prize for the one act play in Hindi named 'Gudiya" and the second prize for the article in Hindi named 'Daiv Daiv Alasi Pukare'. It also bagged the third prize for the biographical essay in English

named 'Turbulent Volcano Pacified: Krantikumar Rangraodada Patil'. The English forum runs 'Spoken English Course' which enhances the speaking ability of the students.

- (7) In the intercollegiate cultural competitions organised by 'Maharashtra Business Training Board' the dances named fusion and 'Gondhal' performed by the students of the Arts Circle got First and Third position respectively.

It also organised a workshop on "The Presentation of the Street Plays".

- (8) We want our students not only mentally strong but also physically fit. We run well-equipped 'Health Club' which was established in 1993, where every year 300 students and more than 100 women from outside take benefit of it. There is multi-gym and 40 latest equipment in the club. Near about 2250 women from outside have taken advantage of it, until now.
- (9) We have 'Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University' Centre since 2003-2004 to cater to the educational needs of those students who were unable to continue their formal education by this or that reason. The centre runs B.A. and B.Com. courses and 400 students are studying in it. The Subjects i.e. Marathi, Hindi, Economics, History, Political Science and Sociology for B.A. III and the subjects i.e. Economics, Banking Commerce and Accounting and Auditing for B.Com. III are taught at special level. In 'The World Police Competition' held at Adelaide (Australia) Miss. Avani Anantrao Sawant, the best swimmer who is working in the Central Police Force, bagged two bronze medals. In addition to this Smt. Unawane Pratibha Jagadish studying in B.A. III stood first in the whole state of

Maharashtra offering the subject of MAR-252 (Literature of Enlightenment) and won 'Murlidhar Vadhere Paritoshik'.

- (10) Every year the students who are economically backward are given monetary help.
- (11) The 'Counselling cell' in our college implemented the scheme 'Apayashatun–Yashakade ' in collaboration with the daily 'Sakal' and 'Manovikas Prabodhini, Kolhapur. The scheme was very beneficial to the students who were frustrated, confused and who scored less marks than their expectation. A questionnaire was prepared and distributed among these students and they were counselled accordingly. Near about 8 to 10 senior teachers of Manovikas Prabodhini, Kolhapur co-operated in this regard. This year it started telephonic counselling during the examination period. Those students who were confused during the exam phoned the members of the cell and the members very delicately created positive attitude in the minds of these confused students. These students were guided about the study habits. Thus the moral and emotional support is generated in the minds of the students, who are unsuccessful in the SSC / HSC Board examinations. The parents are also guided and advised in this regard.

Such counseling was carried out in the whole of Maharashtra and the maximum counseling was carried out by our centre.

- (12) We have a well-managed computer lab. We run various courses in computer application. From June 2007 we run the B.C.A. course sanctioned by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur. 80 students have taken admission to this course. We have 25 P-IV computers available and each has DVD writer alongwith the internet facility, with the help of networking all computers are connected. Emergency

power supply is made available with the help of UPS and battery. It has also internet facility and LAN connection.

- (13) The College takes efforts to preserve trees and to protect environment through its 'Kamala Nature Lovers' club, which fosters the values among the students so that they keep environment pollution free. On 27th August 2007 our club in collaboration with Vishwa-prakriti Nidhi – Bharat, Kolhapur Division, Kolhapur sold plants under the 'Go Green Mission'. Our students bought 1700 plants. The students celebrated 1st October as a 'Vegetarian Day'
- (14) To generate social commitment among our students we have N.S.S. and N.C.C. The activities carried out by the NSS and NCC are described under the heading 'Community Services'.
- (15) Grievance Redressal Cell : The cell has been trying to solve the problems of the students. For this purpose we kept a 'Suggestion Box' in the library and students are told to submit their complaints in the first week of every month. The cell solved the students' complaints about library, exam system and office work.
- (16) Population Education Club: We run Population Education Club on behalf of Adult and continuing Education Department, Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The club arranges various lectures and competitions which will create social awareness and awareness about population among the students'. We celebrate various days like 'Teachers Day', 'World Population Day', 'Literacy Day', the birth anniversaries of Hon'ble persons like Late Lal Bahadur Shastri and the father of Nation: Mahatma Gandhi.

The Club arranged Elocution Competition on behalf of 'Forum of Free Enterprises'. Educational tour to Ratnagiri was arranged for the benefit of the students.

- (17) Social Science Club: Our students should know the current affairs in social, cultural, historical and political fields. In view of this the social science club arranges various lectures for the benefit of the students. Dr. J. B. Shinde delivered a lecture on 'The Search of God'.
- (18) Yoga and Health Club: This club makes efforts to make the students aware about their physical and mental health. On the occasion of 'Breast Feeding Day' i.e. 6th August 2007 Dr. Pratibha Khare delivered a speech on 'Breast Feeding : The need of Child and the Mother'

On 27th July 2007 a workshop was organized by the Department of Home Science in Collaboration with Nestle India Ltd., Miss. Rewati Kulkarni, the Marketing Officer, Nestle India, delivered a speech on the 'Nutritive contents in the food'. On the same topic a one-day workshop for the teachers was also organised on 17/02/2008.

- (19) Commerce Forum: The students belonging to commerce faculty were counselled regarding the M.B.A. I.C.W.A., Company Secretary and C.A. entrance examinations.
- (20) To enhance the literary skills of our students along-with 'Kamala' Magazine, we publish various articles of the students on different issues related to different occasions through our wallpaper named 'Gunjarav'.

- (21) Staff Academy : The Staff Academy arranges lectures on the latest issues concerning art, language, science literature etc. in order to exchange the views and opinions of scholars and learned people with our faculty. This year Dr. Nandakumar Gole delivered a lecture on "Preservation of Health"
- (22) We want to create historical awareness in our students by arranging tours to historical places. We want them to see Nature with its splendid beauty. This helps them to know the life outside the four walls. To fulfil this object there is Tour Committee. This year we arranged tours to Vijaydurga, Gagangiri, Devgad, Kunkeshwar, Ozar, Malvan, Sindhudurga, Tarkarli, Ganpatipule etc.
- (23) Anti Sexual Harassment Committee : Our students should behave freely and that too in a secure atmosphere, therefore we have 'Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee' in our college. On the occasion of the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi the competition of poster presentation regarding 'Women's achievements and their problems' was organized. A one day workshop on 'The Selection of the Spouse and pre-marriage counseling' was organised. Prof. Smt. Sadhana Zadbuke, Smt. Vijaya Kokate and Dr. Saroj Shinde delivered lectures.
- (24) Literacy Mission : Literacy Mission in our college encourages our students to teach the illiterates around them. More than 80 students spontaneously participated in this mission.
- (25) To inculcate the principles of democracy, to foster the decision-making policy and to participate in the overall functioning of the college we have Students Council. We get feed back from it related to teaching, learning, evaluation, and different activities to be

launched upon. Thus we try to inject the quality of leadership among our students.

- (26) **Publicity Cell :** The college tries to be one of the quality colleges in the city of Kolhapur. There are various committees, forums and clubs working for creating quality and excellence. The cell approaches to the media and make them publish and broadcast news regarding the activities carried out by the college.
- (27) **Lead College Activities :** Under the 'Shivaji University Lead College Scheme', the college organised workshops on the following topics which proved very beneficial to not only our students but for other students from various colleges :
- a) Project writing in Environmental Studies.
 - b) 'Street Play presentation'
 - c) Role and Importance of sport for all round development of students.
 - d) Traditional Education towards vocationalization.

Near about 300 students from various colleges attended the workshops. They presented their research papers and the best three papers were given prizes.

- (28) **Adult and Continuing Education Department:** Since 1985 the Department has been training the students in Judo-Karate. It also organised Yoga camp from 20th December to 24th December 2007. Judo-Karate course was run from December 15 to December 30, 2007.

Service to man is service to God. To inculcate this principle among our students we have National Service Scheme in which 200 students and 4 teachers are working. The village named

'Dhabadhabawadi' has been adopted. The following activities are carried out by it in the adopted village and college campus.

N.C.C. :

In the task of 'nation-building' N.C.C. plays its vital role. There are 50 cadets in the N.C.C. who actively participated in various activities. 25 cadets donated blood on the occasion of the birth anniversary of Hon. Late Dr. V. T. Patil. Our cadets participated in the 'pulse polio' inoculation programme. They participated in Anti-dowry, anti-infanticide, and anti corruption rallies. They also participated in 'Granth Dindi'.

C.P.L. Patil Nilam Vitthal was selected for the 'Thal Sainik Camp' in Maharashtra. She was awarded the rank of Jr. Mandal Officer by the Government of Maharashtra for her brilliant performance in the special training and various competitions organised at the 'Thal Sainik Camp' in Delhi. 12 cadets participated in the training programme on the topic

“Management at the Natural Calamity affected areas”. In the ‘Thal Sainik Camps’ held at Kolhapur, Amaravati and Aurangabad 12, 10, 8 and 4 cadets participated respectively. 14 cadets participated in the Pre-RDC camp held at Kolhapur and 6 at Amaravati.

The award of the best NCC cadet of the year 2007-08 was given jointly to JVD Patil Nilam and SGT Mugade Anjani.
