PART A

Kamala College the only women's college in the city of Kolhapur is established in the year 1984 by the late Dr. V. T. Patil. It is one of the colleges which has been trying hard to evolve the everlasting potential among the students in such a fast growing and rapidly changing world of 'Knowledge Culture'. The college receives the U.G.C. recognition under section 2(f) of the act in May 1987 and became eligible to receive financial assistance from the UGC under section 12(b) of the act in January 1992.

The college has been running various courses in Arts and Commerce streams, alongwith various self-financing, Career Oriented and Remedial Courses.

The meeting of the IQAC was arranged on 28th June 2008. The following Plan of Action was chalked out by the IQAC towards quality enhancement.

- 1) Continuation of the career orientation courses.
- 2) Continuation of the self-financing courses.
- 3) To run B.C.A. (II year course) and M.A. (I year) course in Home Science.
- 4) To organise workshops for students and teachers under 'Lead College Scheme'.

- 5) To organise a National Level seminar on the new methodology of NAAC.
- 6) To construct additional 5 classrooms.
- 7) Application of the healthy practices.

The action plan was carried out in the following way :

- (1) The college has been conducting the following career oriented courses.
 1. Hospital Administration and Management
 2. Dietetics and Health Education
 3. Yoga Education and Health.
 4. This year we introduced 'Basic Computer and Information Technology' Course which is sanctioned by the U.G.C.
 5. It is our pleasure to mention that the U.G.C. has also sanctioned another career oriented course i.e. 'Beauty Culture and Therapy, this year. We are going to introduce it from this academic year i.e. 2009-2010.
- (2) We introduced 'P.G. Diploma in Yoga Therapy' under Innovative programme which is also sanctioned by U.G.C.
- (3) The college has been running the following self-financing courses.
 - a. Aerobics
 - b. Judo Karate
 - c. Yogasana
 - d. Spoken English.
- (4) In the last year professional course such as B.C.A. (first year) and M.A. (first year) in Home Science were introduced. This year we are going to continue B.C.A. (II year) and M.A. (II year) in Home Science.

- (5) Under 'Lead College Scheme' we organised the following one day workshops on the following themes in our college.
- a. Health problems of college students.
 - b. Sexual Harassment and family Atrocities.
 - c. Improved Examination system for the first year Degree course.
 - d. Training camp for the college teachers in the subject of Marathi.

(6) On 2nd and 3rd February 2009 the college organised a two day national level seminar on the 'New Methodology of Institutional Assessment and Accreditation of NAAC', sponsored by the UGC.

(7) Due to the growing number of students and courses the college is in badly need of extra classrooms we have sent a proposal to the UGC for the same.

(8) The Healthy Practices :

The overall conduct of the organization is determined to an extent by the healthy practices, which it inculcates within it. We in this regard adopted the following internal quality checks.

- a) Functioning of various committees – There are in all 40 committees and clubs working in our college. Periodical meetings of these committees and clubs are arranged and the Principal surveys their functioning and guides them if need be.
- b) Immediate action is taken regarding the complaints and suggestions of the faculty, non-teaching staff and students.
- c) There is an active IQAC that reviews existing practices and procedures. It takes necessary steps to fulfill the goals and mission of the institution as far as possible.

- d) We have established our contacts with certain industries that can be a source for on the job training for the students. We have established the MOUs with the following institutions :
- 1) Kolhapur Institute of Technology (K.I.T.), Kolhapur
 - 2) G.S. College of Yoga, Kaivalyadham, Lonavala.
 - 3) Hanuman Vyayam Prasarak Mandal's Degree College of Physical Education, Amravati.
 - 4) Maharashtra Centre for Entrepreneurship and Development.
- e) We have various community welfare schemes which are mentioned in the 'B' part. We try to inculcate civic responsibility in our students by arranging various camps like blood donation camps, tree plantation, N.S.S. camps, etc.
- f) There are various prizes for the students who secured the 1st, 2nd and 3rd rank in various examinations. We also give prizes to students for their outstanding performance in sports, N.C.C., N.S.S., various Elocutions, Mehendi and Rangoli Competitions. In addition to this we arranged elocution competition on behalf of Forum of Free Enterprises, Mumbai. The students who got the 1st, 2nd and 3rd position in it were given the cash prizes of Rs.3000/- Rs. 2000/- and Rs. 1000/- respectively. Alongwith these prizes, to promote social commitment Shri. Vishwas Vasantrya Bagal declared an award of "Late Sulekha V. Bagal Scholarship" of Rs.25,000/- for the students who have the sense and faith in social service and social commitment. This year two students of our college namely 1) Miss. Sutar Rohini Gajanan (B.C.A.I) and 2) Miss. Berkal Pooja Bhagwan (B.Com.I) were given this Scholarship for three years.

To promote excellence among our students every year “Hon. Ex.M.P. Udaysingrao Gaikwad paritoshik of Rs.1,000/- in cash with the ‘Sword of Honour’ in loving memory of Tararani, the founder of Karveer Sansthan and daughter-in-law of Shivaji the Great is given to the ideal student of the college. This year Miss. Anjani Mugade (B.A.III, English Department) was given this Parotishik with the Sword of Honour.

In addition to this, freeships, book bank facility and concessions are given to the needy students. There is a credit society, which gives loans to the staff.

- g) We have been trying our level best to promote interactive skills among our students by arranging group discussions, workshops and guest lectures.
- h) It is our motto to promote all round development of personality of our students and to try to achieve the goals by efficient functioning of various committees and clubs of which the details are given in the succeeding part.

Taking into consideration the yeomen service in the field of women’s Education the **Rotary Club** which is an international institution awarded ‘**Rotary Samaj Seva Puraskar**’ to our institution, which is undoubtedly a thing to pride for us.

PART B

**ACTIVITIES REFLECTING THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES
OF THE INSTITUTIONS:**

The Mission :

- 1) Dissemination of women's education and inculcation of need based academic and intellectual skills.
- 2) Inculcate moral values and scientific temper.
- 3) Overall development of personality.

Goals :

- 1) Introduction of career-oriented subjects.
- 2) Imparting latest academic knowledge in order to make our students successful to face the challenges of life.
- 3) Promotion and enhancement of students' literary and inborn skills in music, dance, dramatics and craft.
- 4) Organization of 'Self-Supporting Courses' not only for our students but for other women, also.
- 5) Encouragement to players to participate in various sports at various levels to show their best performance.
- 6) Motivation of the students for further study and their preparation for facing various competitive examinations.
- 7) Enrichment of library by adding latest reference books, journals, magazines and various newspapers.
- 8) Organization of various extension activities in addition to NSS and NCC for the cultivation of values.

To achieve the goals and objectives of our institution we have been carrying out various activities through various committees and clubs in the college. We have Career Guidance Committee, Competitive Examination Committee, Elocution Committee, Magazine Committee, Admission Committee, Andhashraddha Nirmulan Samitee, Marathi Sahitya Mandal, English Forum, Hindi Sahitya Mandal, Commerce forum, Social Science Club etc. These committees and clubs organise lectures on Various disciplines of learning. Various competitions are also arranged throughout the year.

- (1) Every year we arrange Annual Social Gathering to develop the hidden Potentials of the students in music, dramatics, elocution and other allied arts. On 15th January 2009 we arranged Food Festival and 'Funny Games' and on 16th January 2009 Variety show was organised.
- (2) The Vivid Kalagun Vikas Mandal, The Marathi Sahitya Mandal, Hindi Sahitya Mandal and English Forum in our College are doing their best to promote the literary skills in the students by arranging various competitions like Poetry Reading, Essay Writing, Elocution etc.
- (3) To enhance literary skills of our students alongwith 'Kamala' Magazine we publish various articles of the students on different issues related different occasions through our wallpaper named 'Gunjarav'. Our college bagged the first prize and second prize for the articles in English entitled (1) 'The Sunset of Anandvan', (2) 'Growing significance of service sector in India' respectively in the Shivaji University intercollegiate Magazine Competition.
- (4) In this world of competition we have been trying to make our students capable to get job opportunities so that they should be self-reliant. In view of this we have "Competitive Examination Guidance and Personality Development Cell". The cell arranged:

1. Four Day Workshop on 'Life skills and Personality Development in collaboration with Roohi Institute Columbia and Glory Personality Development Centre on 24th July to 28th July 2008.
2. Two Day workshop on 'Competitive Examination and Career Guidance' on 8th August and 9th August 2008.
3. A campus interview for the post of Financial Advisor Unit Manager on behalf of ICICI Prudential on 16th February 2009.
4. Seminars on 'Soft Skill Development and Interview Techniques' and 'Career opportunities in Business Management and Aviation Industry'.

Due to these efforts our students Miss. Priyadarshani More, Miss. Manisha Pradhan, Miss Gitanjali Patil and Miss Arati Power were selected as Sale-Tax Inspector, P.S.I., Officer in state Bank of India and Police Constable respectively.

It is a thing of honour to us that this year Miss. Priyadarshani More stood first in the state of Maharashtra among the girl students who appeared for the competitive examination, for the post of Deputy Chief Executive Officer.

- (5) As usual the Psychological Counseling and Guidance cell in our college implemented the scheme of Apayashatun-Yashakade in collaboration with the daily 'Sakal'. The students who were frustrated, confused and scored less marks than their expectation were benefited by the scheme. Even telephonic counselling to the students was given free of charge by the teachers of psychology. 24 students were benefited immensely by this scheme. The students were guided about the study habits. Thus the moral and emotional support is given by the cell to such students.

- (6) To create scientific attitude, intellectual approach and logical reasoning in our student there is a 'Maharashtra Vivek Wahini' functioning in our college. Various lectures were arranged by it and students were guided accordingly.
- (7) There is 'Andhashraddha Nirmulan Samitee' that has been trying to eradicate blind beliefs and superstitions. It conducted 'Satyashodh Prabodhan examination'. 50 students appeared for it.
- (8) Those students who are poor in English and Accountancy are guided by arranging extra periods. SC / ST students are also guided.
- (9) The English Forum runs 'Spoken English Course' which enhances speaking ability of the students.
- (10) Hindi Sahitya Mandal and Marathi Vangamaya Vadvivad Mandal organise various competitions such as Elocution, Essay writing etc. in order to foster the basic skills of the students. The commerce forum imbibes in the minds of the students new concepts in commerce stream and social science club creates social awareness among students.
- (11) The college takes efforts to preserve trees and to protect environment through its 'Kamala Nature Lovers Club' which generate the civic values among the students so that they keep environment pollution free. On 6th October 2008 the club in collaboration with Vishwa-Prakriti-Nidhi-Bharat, Kolhapur Division, Kolhapur displayed a slide show on the variety of plants found in the rainy season in the western Ghat of Maharashtra.
- (12) The Art Circle in our college is always keen to enhance the artistic skills and create 'stage daring' among the students. On 8th October 2008 on the occasion of Navratra Utsav the Art Circle organised 'Ras-Garba Dandiya'.

- (13) To create historical awareness in our students the Tour Committee in our college arranges tours to historical places. To acquaint the students with the enchanting beauty of Nature the Committee arranges the tours to Marleshwar, Ganapatipule, Ratnagiri, Pavas, Vijaydurga, Devgad, Ozar etc.
- (14) Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee: We desire our students should behave freely and that too in secure atmosphere. In view of the above, Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee has been working in our college. Dr. Smt. Vaishali Kanade (M.B.B.S., D.G.O.) was invited to have a dialogue with our students on the topic ‘Women’s Health Problems’. She guided our students how to solve their health problems.

(15) Yoga and Health Awareness Club :

Various activities were carried out by this club to create health awareness among our students. On 4th August 2008 group discussion on the topic ‘Breast-feeding’ was arranged. On 13th August 2008 an awareness programme on ‘Adolescent female Health and Reproduction’ was organised. On 1st September 2008 a wall paper on the topic “The requirement of various nutrient elements for Good Health” was published.

(16) Kamala Health Club :

In order to make our students strong and sturdy we run a well equipped ‘Health Club’, which was established in the year 1993. 2500 women, until now, have been benefited by it. There is a multi-gym and 40 ultramodern equipment in the club. Students are trained in Yogasanas, aerobics and other physical exercise. “Physical Fitness Programme” was carried out by the club for the benefit of the students.

(17) Adult and Continuing Education Department:

The Department has been running various short term courses such as 'Judo Karate and Aerobics' and Yoga. From 16th February to 28th February 2009 the Department ran 'Judo Karate' and 'Aerobics' courses. So also the department organised 'Yoga Shibir' from 16th February to 22nd February 2009. 30 students have participated in these courses.

(18) Hostel Management Committee :

The Committee not only looks after the quality of food and hygienic problems of the students who reside in the hostel but also encourage the inborn skills by organizing various programmes such as folk art, Rangoli and Mehendi competitions, Comedy Express, handwriting competition etc. Dr. Smt. Sakhadev was invited in the hostel who displayed LCD presentation on the topic 'Menstruation problem and precaution'. On 27th December 2008 a Hostel Day was celebrated.

(19) Anti-Ragging Committee :

We have anti-Ragging committee, Control room and flying squad to create peaceful and conducive atmosphere in the hostel. On 17th December 2008 we invited Dr. Bharati Patil to deliver a speech on "Disadvantages of Ragging". The flying squad of the college frequently visit the hostel and through its Control Room it keeps its watch on the working of Anti-Ragging Committee.

(20) Admission Committee :

Every year during the Admission period the Admission Committee counsels the students which subjects to be offered for their degree courses. It takes every care to see whether the reservation policy is followed or not in the admission process.

(21) Grievance Redressal Cell :

Complaints of the students regarding library working, examination system and cleanness of campus are solved by the cell. There is a suggestion box kept in the library in which students submit their complaints. The cell considers the complaints rigorously on every first week of every month and takes necessary action.

(22) Literacy Mission :

On 4th September 2008 we celebrated 'The Literacy Day'. Students were advised to teach the illiterates around them. On 2nd October 2008 a lecture was arranged at 'Kogil Khurd': the adopted village of the college. Dr. Smt Vidya Salokhe delivered a speech on the topic 'Responsibility of Parents'.

(23) Population Education Club :

On behalf of Adult and Continuing Education Department of Shivaji University Kolhapur we have been running the Population Education Club which tries to enhance the quality of the population. It carries out various activities such as essay writing competition, seminars etc. On 11th July 2008 it celebrated the population Day. On 21st August 2008, 4th September 2008 and 8th September 2008 the club arranged seminars on 'Economic progress in Post independence time', 'Ideal Mother and Women Education' and 'Indian Literacy : Reality and Failure' respectively. On 29th September 2008 Dr. Miss. Wale (Medical Officer, Savitribai Phule Hospital) was invited to deliver a lecture on 'Heart Diseases'. An Educational tour to villages named 'Dhamod' and 'Keloshi' was arranged on 21st October 2008. on 1st December 2008 and 23rd December 2008 seminars on 'AIDS Awareness' and 'the Directions of Development of Indian Agriculture' were arranged respectively.

(24) Lead College Activities :

Under the 'Shivaji University Lead College Scheme' our college organised workshops on the following topics.

1. The problems of health of college girls.
2. Awareness among students about sexual atrocity and family violence.
3. B.A. I : Improved Examination System.

There were 110 students from various colleges attended the workshops.

(25) Students' Welfare Scheme :

The students who are poor, orphan and needy are given monetary help. Such students use money for their bus-passes, exam fees and purchase of books. This year Rs. 5,200/- were given to students. One of the teachers of our college Smt. Manisha Ghotane deposited Rs. 551/- to the Students Welfare Fund for the benefit of the students.

(26) There is a well equipped computer lab having 25 P-IV computers with internet facility and DVD Writers. Recently we bought 10 more desktop PCs with 21" LCDs. All computers are connected with LAN. From June 2007 we have been running the three year integrated B.C.A. course. In the last year 61 students took admission for B.C.A. IInd year course. This year we are going to start B.C.A. IIIrd year course. The B.C.A. Department runs various career oriented courses such as 'Tally' and 'Basic Computer and Information Technology'.

(27) There is 'Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra open University Centre' in our college. Since 2003-2004 the centre has been catering to the educational needs of the students who were unable to continue their

formal education. The students who are failed in the 10th and 12th Std. and are 18 years old are given admissions. There are 400 students who enrolled their names for various courses run by the centre. For B.A. Course following subjects are taught at special level 1) Marathi, 2) Hindi, 3) Economics, 4) Sociology, 5) History, 6) Politics.

(28) To enhance social commitment among our students we have NSS and NCC. The activities carried out by the NSS and NCC are described under the heading 'community services'.

(29) Staff Academy :

To acquire latest information and to exchange the views and opinions of scholars and learned people with our faculty we arrange lectures. This year on 27th January 2009 we arranged a lecture of Dr. G. P. Mali, on the topic 'Literary creation born in the prison'.

(30) Every year '**Students Council**' is formed. All class representatives are made the members of various committees functioning in the college. Their opinions and views are taken into consideration. Thus the principles of democracy and leadership are inculcated in them. We get feedback from the students about teaching learning evaluation and different activities to be carried out. Immediate action is taken as per the suggestion given by the students.

(31) Alumnae Association :

The Alumnae association organised 'A two day dental checkup camp' in our college on 11th and 12th November 2008 in collaboration with Tatyasaheb Kore Dental College, Warnanagar. On 20th December 2008 Adv. Manjusha Patil, a Government Pleader delivered a lecture on the topic "The problems of the college students and the remedies". A Group Discussion on "the stress of Annual Exam" was arranged in the hostel on 24th February 2009. Dr. Bharat Naik shared his views with the students about it.

(32) The Parent Teacher Association (PTA) :

The growth and success of the institution involves the participation of its stake holders, such as students, parents etc. In view of the above we established P.T.A. in our college. The Association gives very important suggestions regarding syllabi, examination system and need based courses. The college takes action to fulfill their suggestions.

In addition to this we arrange unit tests, group discussions and seminars related to the subjects.

The process of admissions and various accounts of the office is computerised.

Q. 26) Increase in the infrastructural facilities :

The construction work of IInd floor of the Women's Hostel Building is nearly completed and that of the auditorium is going on.

Q. 27) Technology up-gradation.

Educational CDs are used for the benefit of the students. LCD projector OHP are also used in teaching.

Q. 28) Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students.

The internet facility is available not only for teachers but also for students at reasonable rate.

Q. 29) Financial Aid to Students :

Financial aid of Rs. 17,100/- was given to 72 students during the year 2008-09.
