



A large number of students not only from our institution but from other institutions also needs to do M.A. in English and Yoga Shashtra as there is no Department in the University of Yoga Shashtra and there are limited seats available for the students in the Department of English of the University.

4) The Practice

To fulfil these we started M.A. in English and Yoga Shashtra after getting the due sanction from the Government of Maharashtra and their affiliation from Shivaji University, Kolhapur.
