# Tararani Vidyapeeth's KAMALA COLLEGE, KOLHAPUR

## Supplementary Report (November 2010 to January 2012)

Kamala College, Kolhapur has submitted its 'Re-Accreditation Report' to NAAC Bangalore on 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2010. The report consists the information of the college upto November 2010 under Seven Criteria. The Peer Team visit to our college is scheduled on 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> February 2012 by the NAAC. Hence the Supplementary Report of the college bearing the information of the period between November 2010 to January 2012.

## **CRITERION I: Curricular Aspects**

- At Present College runs 17 various programmes such as (1) conventional programmes B.A., B.Com. (2) Professional courses B.C.A. (3) B.A., B.Com. courses of Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University (Y.C.M.O.U.) Centre (4) Self-financing courses such as M.A. Home Science, P.G. Diploma in Yoga Therapy (5) 6 Career oriented courses and 3 short term courses. In spite of these programmes, there is a growing demand of the students of the YCMOU Centre to introduce M.A. in Marathi therefore to cater to their need the college introduced M.A. in Marathi Subject under distance mode.
- Before introducing courses we collect feedback on curriculum from students, alumni, parents and employers. The college cogitates on its, plans and executes activities taking into consideration on the vision, mission and goals of the college.

# **CRITERION II: Teaching Learning and Evaluation:**

- Various departments in the college make use of modern technology such as computer, LCD, OHP, tape-recorder, audio-visual aids etc., to create effective learning experiences for students.
- Remedial coaching for SC / ST students in the subject of compulsory English for B.A. III class and the remedial coaching for SC / ST students for their Entry in Services is continued.
- Telephonic guidance is given to those students who are differently abled.
- Letters are sent to the parents of those students who do not attend the classes regularly.
- Semester pattern with internal evaluation for the first and second year of the degree courses is implemented. The 80 + 20 pattern for the third year of the degree course is continued.
- Apart from the terminal examination the college arranges surprise tests, orals, group discussions, paper presentations and tutorials for the conventional B.A., B.Com. Courses.
- For M.A. Home Science, B.C.A., P.G. Diploma in Yoga Therapy and Career Oriented Courses, Seminars, Project Work and practical are arranged.
- Students made paper presentations enthusiastically and even some of the them made power point presentation also.
- The provision for mentoring of students is continued.
