There has been a long-drawn controversy in legal circles as to whether Company being a juristic/artificial person and incapable of being sent to prison may still be prosecuted and punished for an offence where imprisonment is mandatory part of sentence. There is no controversy when statute entrusts the court with discretion to inflict fine or imprisonment, as in this case court shall inflict only fine on Company. Judicial controversy arises in the situation when statute prescribes mandatory imprisonment as punishment for an offence.

Penal law basically aims at punishing persons found guilty of commission of offence. In the statutes defining crimes, the prohibition is frequently directed against any person who commits the prohibited act. Term 'person' as defined in Section 11 of the Penal Code and Section 2(42) of the General Clauses Act, 1872 includes clearly within its fold a Company, which is juristic person. Various enactments like the Prevention of Food Adulteration Act, 1954(Section 17), the Essential Commodities Act, 1955 (Section 10), the NDPS Act, 1985 (Section 38), the Trade Marks Act, 1999 (Section 114), the Income Tax Act, 1961 (Section 267-C and 278-B) and the Cable Television Networks (Registration) Act, 1955 (Section 17) provide for penal liability of a Company I relation to the offences prescribed in these Acts. This liability is apart from the liability attached to the persons who at the time of commission of the offence were in charge of, or responsible for the conduct of business of the Company including the Director, Manager, Secretary or other officers of the Company with whose consent or connivance, the offence was committed.
